Notes of the song and Its Historical Context:

This is very similar to Bar240, "Manchester's an Altered Town". It is clear that one is a reworking of the other but it is impossible to establish which came first. Both songs mention the new police that were established in Liverpool in 1836 and Manchester in 1839 http://www.manchester-family-history-research.co.uk/new_page_33.htm.; both songs make mention of Zoological Gardens and both cities had zoos (Liverpool's opened in 1833http://www.flickr.com/photos/44435674@N00/5643461269/ and Manchester's in 1836 http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Belle Vue Zoological Gardens); and, both songs were printed by Harkness of Preston.

Crown Street was the original Liverpool terminus of the Liverpool and Manchester Railway. Lime Street opened in 1836 and this may be the station mentioned in the song.

Roy Plamer (Touch on the times ISBN 0140811826), says that a version dealing with Preston also exists.
